

GO AHEAD AND PRAISE HIM

“My God is so great, so strong and so mighty, there’s nothing my God cannot do.” So goes the song. So let’s take a look back over the past seventeen or eighteen months, a difficult time that we have lived through, to see how our God has been working; bringing good things out of COVID-19 that we can thank and praise Him for. We’ll be like the one leper who turned back to thank Jesus after his healing. Several have submitted their thoughts and these have been loosely categorized below. Perhaps you will be able to identify with some of these and respond with thanksgiving and praise.

Financial Benefits:

- Some doctors are giving \$100 to those who will take the vaccine.
- Many have realized they can live with less and are buying fewer ‘things’, and are donating things they don’t need to others.

Practical:

- Some people actually got around to clearing out their closets, drawers, and garages.
- Members of various organizations served others’ needs, bringing meals, water, food, and household items to the homes of the housebound.
- Some countries have offered other countries help with vaccines.

Insights:

- Some became aware of how much God loves and cares for them.
- Due to the quarantine, some can now empathize with those who were housebound even before the pandemic.
- Some have spent time reflecting on God’s will for their lives.
- Some people are now more spiritually sensitive; and desire to go to church.

Relationships:

- Many have a new appreciation for family and friends in their lives.
- “I now realize how important it is not only to pray for others, but also to let them know I’m praying for them.”
- “I was made aware of the importance of reaching out to

those in need – with my time, finances, etc.”

- Having more time to spend with the Lord, some have grown closer to Him.
- One lady says she’s thankful for how deep the bond in her family has become due to the pandemic. She “was forced to see a more holistic version of each family member and we all have gotten a lot closer because we weren’t so busy living ‘every-day’ lives.”
- This time has been an opportunity to renew old friendships by phone, Skype, etc.

Life Styles:

- One lady said she’s an introvert so she loved how the pandemic catered to her style of living, filtering out a lot of ‘fluff’ relationships/interactions and forcing people to work toward true connections. “An introvert’s dream come true!”
- Another lady said she has taken a look at her behavioral patterns and realizes that much of what she does must be reorganized.
- For one person, the onset of the pandemic followed the completion of a resignation process and prevented the continuation of additional emotional pressure. She says, “The Lord had plans for my life I had not anticipated. He helped me make critical decisions and transitions I needed to make.”
- Many who once followed God and slacked off have turned back to

the One Who loves us enough to turn us back to Him through difficulties we face.

Health/Medical:

- One lady’s son was very ill (non-COVID related) and hospitalized during the pandemic. She thanks God for the pastors, brothers, and sisters of her church who prayed with her for her son’s healing. God answered and he is well now. Praise God!
- Many can thank God for His mercy and protection all through the pandemic.
- Medical researchers have been put in a position of trying to find a vaccine to help with the COVID threat to the whole world.
- Doctors and patients now have access to house visits via telehealth services.

Mental Health:

- Many thank God for His amazing grace that has kept them both sane and physically healthy.
- Many who attended church functions via various forms of technology were greatly encouraged by the Lord and the fellowship they experienced with other believers.

Technology:

- Despite restrictions on physically attending church, the Worship Services, Sunday School classes, Prayer Meetings, Life Groups, Bible Studies, Youth Meetings, and even Business Meetings continued for many churches via various technology platforms, so that all who wanted to attend could do so. This was especially meaningful for shut-ins. We were even able to give our offerings via technology. Praise God!!!
- Many have grown in their understanding of technology and can now communicate with others in person or online.
- Teachers learned how to teach using technology and there are now many classes that people of all ages can take online.
- The spread of technology to many might be an avenue for everyone to see Christ when He returns.

Spreading the Word:

- Although many para-church and missionary organizations were already using technology before the pandemic, many creatively added to their ministries through which God's wonderful plan of salvation could go out.
- In 2020 the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association began broadcasting Gospel TV spots with the Good News of Jesus Christ that can be seen across the U.S. Over 375,000 calls have been received in response to the Gospel TV Spots and thousands have made decisions for Christ!

- “An amazing **16,416,717 children** got to hear about Jesus in nearly every country of the world through CEF! (These are the ones that could be counted – not the ones who might have seen the TV broadcasts or heard it on the radio or received a booklet!) Of that number, over **5.6 MILLION children** said they put their trust in Jesus as Savior. That's 5,616,810 children who are now in God's family and will have an impact on millions of other people for the rest of their lives!” (Excerpt from Child Evangelism Fellowship Newsletter)
- One lady, a senior citizen who has been learning more and more about technology, decided to start her own Sunday School class on Zoom. She now has thirty-two students (with more wanting to join) from around the world attending on Thursdays, from N.Y. and N.J. in the U.S., the U.K. and Spain in Europe, Islamabad, Karachi, and Lahore in Pakistan, and Dubai. She's teaching about Jesus through Bible stories. Not only are the children hearing the wonderful news of Jesus, but some adults who have never heard about Jesus are listening in and being impacted through her ministry.

A Challenge for now and the future:

- One brother challenged me to see this pandemic as a testing of our faith. In it, we are challenged to remain faithful to God and His truth. Regardless of what lies ahead, God is forever faithful. He

is preparing us for what lies ahead.

Timing:

- In November 2019, three months before the pandemic spread vigorously, The Holy Spirit urged me to rent out my first floor apartment that I had been using as an Air BNB. It was rented in three days. I didn't know the future, but God did. I thank God for looking out for me!
- During the pandemic, I worked at home and saved money by not commuting to and from work. With the money saved, I am now in my second year of taking voice lessons. I am thankful to God that I can use a much better voice to sing praise to Him. I've also learned more about humility and spiritual principles through the journey of taking voice lessons!
